At its core, the true impact of Valley Children's Healthcare is best measured by one powerful metric: the difference we make in the lives of the children we care for each day.

Valley Children's services span the Central Valley, from Kern County to the State Capital and from the Central Coast to the eastern Sierra, and is home to more than 1.3 million children. It is described as a region of "contradictions" - urban and rural communities, affluence and generational poverty, abundance and a place where 1 in 4 children do not have access to enough food to eat. These realities present our greatest challenges and our greatest opportunities to impact the lives of the children and communities we serve.

Beyond our clinical care, Valley Children's also plays a vital role in strengthening the region's economy. With a total economic impact of more than \$1 billion a year, our contributions include more than \$600 million in direct spending and support for more than 6,100 jobs. Through meaningful partnerships with local organizations, Valley Children's has also invested more than \$600 million over the past 12 years to support children and help shape a stronger future for the Valley.
